After a very long and continuing legal battle with the Department of Education, work has finally started on the new site for Amasango School. The ground has been levelled, and utilities are being laid. Initially, the school will be moved into temporary buildings (some of which are coming from the current site) before permanent structures are put in place. The school are still pushing to ensure that the permanent structures are fit for purpose and will meet the needs of the growing school.
